We, the undersigned staff at the San Francisco Public Defender's Office, show unwavering solidarity with the Palestinian people, who continue to resist decades of the Israeli regime's <u>colonial occupation</u>, <u>apartheid</u>, and <u>genocide funded by US taxpayers</u>. We express our unconditional support for Palestinian liberation and self-determination. We deeply mourn the lives lost, grieve with our colleagues who are directly impacted by the escalated genocidal massacres, and commit to fight for the living.

We unapologetically uplift the demands of Palestinians on the ground in Gaza. Choosing silence in the midst of genocide contradicts our office's mission to confront state-sponsored violence, defend people who are the targets of that violence, and advocate for community power. We denounce the Israeli and US governments for all the violence across occupied Palestine.

- ➤ There are thousands of Palestinians, including children, held hostage in Israeli jails without charges or due process. The number has doubled since 10/7/23.
- When Palestinian hostages have a trial, they face nearly a 100% conviction rate.
- ➤ Besieged Gaza is the world's largest <u>"open-air prison"</u> under nonstop surveillance, <u>which is then</u> <u>used to surveil marginalized communities across the US.</u>
- > Police departments in the US are trained by the Israeli regime and Israeli military weapons are first "battle tested" on besieged Palestinians. These tactics and weapons are then used to oppress and repress low-income Black and non-Black communities of color our office serves.

We recognize the interdependence of Palestinian liberation and that of all oppressed peoples everywhere. Antisemitism, Islamophobia, and anti-Arab violence have no place anywhere - especially in our movements for collective liberation. We stand with our Jewish, Muslim, and Arab clients, colleagues, neighbors, friends, and community members. We join <u>Jewish allies and organizations</u> across the globe who are mourning the loss of loved ones and who refuse to allow the Israeli government to weaponize their grief to enact genocide. In the words of abolitionist scholar Ruth Wilson Gilmore, "Where life is precious, life is precious."

We encourage other allies to watch, listen, learn, and take action to stop the genocide in Gaza.
